Dear Clients, Partners, and Friends,

The results for the South Ocean Management composite and Hong Kong Partner's L.P. before management fees, were as follows:

February trading was subdued in the Hong Kong market as Chinese New Year's was celebrated mid-month. Many companies went into a 'black-out' period before the earnings reporting season that begins this month, not seeing nor talking to investors. We took advantage of the lull, adding more stocks to our small/mid cap, China-focused portfolios, as the Hang Seng Index slid to 8 month lows. Cash holdings are 6% of total portfolio value today.

Hong Kong is an in-efficient market in some ways. Financial reporting is infrequent, for some reason, as Hong Kong regulators call for companies to report every 6 months to shareholders over more normal 3-month reporting requirements demanded by the rest of the world's stock exchanges (even China). Coupled with minimal information rendered in corporate reports, investors often are lead to 'emotional' decisions (from fear, exuberance or boredom) with their investments. This is especially true with those less-followed, neglected companies where we focus.

In late January and early February, we purchased 6 new positions and added to an existing one. We diversified into a high-end watch retailer (Hengdeli), a leading metals recycler (China Metal Recycle), free Chinese newspaper (Sing Tao), specialty paint supplier (Schramm AG), aluminum extrusion producer (China Zhongwang) and an oil play (Petro-China). These companies benefit from earnings derived from operations in China, the fastest growing country on earth (Hong Kong newspaper Sing Tao, which we bought just above net cash per share, a slight exception, yet benefits from PRC advertisements).
